

What is Wood Badge?

Wood Badge is the most advanced training course for adults offered by the Boy Scouts of America. The training course is rich in Scouting history and tradition.

Prerequisites:

- Be registered adult member of the Boy Scouts of America
- Have completed basic training requirements for your registered Scouting position prior to the course
- Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. All participants are required to complete the Annual Health and Medical Record (parts A, B

YOUTH PROTECTION TRAINING (YPT)

ALL YPT Renewals are Due BEFORE October 1



YOUTH PROTECTION TRAINING (YPT)

Everyone: Get a head start NOW to complete your annually required Youth Protection Training.

YPT taken during 2023 is required for recharter.

My.Scouting.org *

(You can retake YPT at My.Scouting.org any time during the calendar year. It will not be "assigned" to you in the system.)

In-person YPT will be scheduled for mid-September

- RECOMMENDED for ALL adults even if you are not registered.
- REQUIRED for all registered adults before October 1st.

<u>SSC YPT POLICY:</u> YPT is <u>required annually</u> in Southern Sierra Council (SSC) per Board policy established in 2015. Although National BSA has a minimum 2-year requirement, SSC requires ANNUAL (every calendar year) renewal of YPT by all registered adults for recharter qualification.


*ONLINE BEST PRACTICES: For best results please consider:

- Complete online YPT BEFORE September. After September EVERYONE IN THE ENTIRE
 NATION is trying to update their YPT simultaneously, which often causes a delay/overload to the
 My.Scouting system during this time.
- Use a desktop or laptop computer. DO NOT use your phone or IPad to take these trainings since
 it may not let you complete the training and/or may not generate your certificate.
- Use Google Chrome when accessing My.Scouting.org (other platforms are not necessarily supported)
- Logon during the early morning hours to avoid the rush of East Coast scouters logging in due to the time difference.
- Be patient. Once you complete your training on My.Scouting.org, it may take upto 24 hours for

you to receive your completion certificate by email.

• If you continue to experience issues with the online YPT course, please send me an email with screenshots and a description of your experience. Do not keep trying to take it repeatedly. We will work out the issues together.

Attention Committee Chairs, Cubmasters, Scoutmasters, and Unit Commissioners:

You have received an email with a survey regarding potential interest in our scheduled fall 2023 BALOO/IOLS courses.

Please make it a priority to respond to the survey **before June 30** so we can take appropriate actions on offering these courses effectively for all volunteers.

- BALOO (Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation) training is required for all Packs to have a BALOO-trained adult participate at every outdoor activity and overnight campout.
- IOLS (Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills) training is required for all Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters to be fully trained and qualify for recharter in that leadership position.

TRAINERS, PRESENTERS,

COOKS, & HEALTH OFFICERS

We appreciate all our volunteers' time, treasures, and talent!

Join the training team as a trainer, presenter, cook, or as a Health Officer**.

What's involved:

- · Attend the 4 Council Training Committee meetings annually (March, May, August, September)
- Participate in 1-2 (or more) Council training events of your choice annually.
- Trainers/Presenters Teach BSA outdoor skills, CPR/fst Aid* skills, presentation skills, and/or leadership skills to adult learners and Scouts BSA; Course syllabus already outlines the scope and expectations for you. (*trainer must be CPR-trainer certified)
- · Cooks become BSA food service and safety certified. Council will pay for your training!
- **Health Officers** **must be a currently certified healthcare professional (EMT, Nurse, Doctor, or similar) and complete the BSA Health Officer training (review a short PowerPoint). Primary responsibility is basic first aid only; if more medical attention is required call 911.

Courses needing adult volunteer trainers and presenters:

- Den Chief (morning; Fall)
- Fundamentals of Training (morning; Fall)
- Trainers EDGE (all day; April)
- · CPR/1st Aid (*trainer must have current CPR-trainer certification) (TBD)

Courses needing adult volunteer trainers/presenters, cooks, and health officers:

- BALOO/IOLS 1½ days includes overnight camping (Fall/Spring)
- NYLT 5 weekdays, 2 weekend days including camping (Summer)
- Wilderness First Aid 2 days including overnight camping (TBD)
- Wood Badge 5 days on course (3 days-F/S/S & 2 days-S/S); may be additional days for staff development and pre-course set up with staff (Fall)

Safety in Scouting

Incident Reporting Helps

Timely and complete incident reporting provides the BSA with an opportunity for analysis of incidents that occur and promotes continuous improvement of our programs. In our experience, the sooner a clear, concise, and complete incident report is made, the sooner that an appropriate response to the incident can occur.



GENERAL INFORMATION

What is an incident? There are three types of reportable incidents:

- Near Miss—A near miss does not result in injury, illness, or damage, by definition, but it had the
 potential to do so.
- General Liability—Events or allegations of injury, illness, or property damage, including employment, director, and officer issues.
- Youth Protection/Membership Infraction—Allegations of abuse, violations of BSA guidelines or policies, or inappropriate behavior by a Scout/Scout leader/parent/other.

Why report an incident? The information reported from incidents helps identify areas for improvement so we can help prevent the reoccurrence of similar incidents. The BSA cannot address a concern if we do not know about it. Reporting incidents promptly is also critical so the BSA can respond in a timely manner and manage claims properly.

When do I report an incident? You should immediately contact your local council to report and get assistance with serious, fatal or abuse incidents. Report within 24 hours if an injury or illness cannot be treated by Scout-rendered first aid, a medical professional such as a doctor or nurse was needed, or an ambulance was called.

How do I report an incident? There are incident reporting tools to assist you in collecting the facts of the incident to provide to the council. This is available on the council website www.sscbsa.org. Scroll down on the home page to "Incident Reporting Tools".

Reporting tips: It is important that incident reports are filled out as completely & timely as possible. This will help bring clarity to the situation and avoid unnecessary calls or emails for additional information. Photographs of the site, facilities, vehicles, or equipment can add value to the report. Remember to include only pertinent facts about the incident. Do not assign blame or include personal opinions. Stick to the facts.



NEW FOR 2023Effective September 1, 2023:

Two registered adult leaders 21 years of age or over are required at all Scouting activities, including all meetings. There must be a registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over in every unit serving females. A registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over must be present for any activity involving female youth or female adult program participants.

Notwithstanding the minimum leader requirements, age and programappropriate supervision must always be provided.

All adults staying overnight in connection with a Scouting activity must be currently registered in an adult fee required position as listed or as an adult program participant. [Limited exception [follow link for exception details] for Cub Scout overnight Programs.] (Note: Registration as a Merit Badge Counselor does NOT meet this requirement.)

All adults (ages 18+) participating with the Pack, Troop, or Venture Crew with overnight scouting activities and camping MUST BE:

- Registered with BSA
- · Background Checked
- Fingerprinted
- Complete Youth Protection Training (My.Scouting.org)
- Complete the corresponding training for your primary position. (For example: If you are registered as a Committee Member, you must complete Committee Training and YPT on My.Scouting.org.)

Please communicate with your Committee Chair and Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, or Crew Advisor about what registered position you will fulfill with the Pack, Troop, or Venture Crew.

We appreciate your continued participation and volunteering with unit and

council events and activities. Thank you for completing these BSA requirements before September 2023.
