Spring Camp Card Sale Scout can earn their adventure!



The Camp Card sale has begun! AND it's not too late to join.

The Southern Sierra Council Camp Card sale is a springtime fundraiser that will help Packs, Troops Crews and their Scouts earn money for summer adventures. The Camp Card features a variety of

coupons and discounts for businesses, such as Smart & Final, Big 5, Rusty's Pizza, Valvoline Oil Changes, El Pollo Loco, Bakersfield E-sports, MB2 Entertainment, Jersey Mikes, Hurricane Harbor and a few others.

The card sells for \$5. Commission for the sale is 50%... \$2.50 per card.

There are no upfront costs to the unit, and no risk (you can return unsold cards).

There is a prize program for the Scouts that sell. The Council Event card is the prize that Scouts are able to earn for selling Camp Cards. The Council Event card can be used for registration fees for any Council event, excluding Order of the Arrow events. These include: Trail to First Class Palooza, Merit Badge Midway, Cub Scout Day Camp, one-day Cub Scout activities, and other Council sponsored events that have a registration fee. The more cards that a Scout sells, the greater value for discounts to Council Events they will earn.

There is a EXTRA bonus, too! Each week, there will be a drawing for a Dewar's Ice Cream gift card. Scouts that sell 20 cards in a week will be entered into the drawing. If a Scout sells 2 sets of 20 cards (40 cards), they will be entered twice! <u>Unit Camp</u> Card Coordinators must send Randy an email with the names of eligible Scouts by Monday at noon. The drawing will be done on Monday afternoon and the prize delivered to the unit before their weekly Scout meeting to present to the winner. So, spread the word to your Scouts!

SPRING RECRUITMENT

Spring Recruitment is simply the process of inviting and registering new Scouts and their families in the Scouting program. Spring Recruitment is for kindergarten-age youth going into 1st grade through 4th grade youth going into 5th grade.

Recruiting is a year-round responsibility of all of our adults and youth in the Southern Sierra Council. Spring can be a great time to recruit as the promise of summer camp adventures are only weeks away. Prospective Scouts and families are thinking about nice weather, the outdoors, and activities that are at the core of the Scouting camping experiences.

Advancement on your schedule to "catch-up"...but only if you want. New families joining are more concerned with their youth having fun verses earning a rank.

Four Things you can do right now.

- 1. Set a goal
- 2. Be found on BeAScout (include QR code)
- 3. Social Media (include link)
- 4. Showcase Scouting at Community Events

Lean in on day camp as a 60-90 day out experience a family can build towards.

<u>Note</u>: Spring Recruiting is NOT for youth going into kindergarten. Lion recruitment starts August 1. There are no summer opportunities for Lions and Lions should register as close to the start time of the program for their den, which is the fall. If inquiries are made, packs should collect information and invite these families to recruitment opportunities starting in August.

It is also recommended that packs don't do spring recruitment for youth entering the 6th grade. If there are inquiries, packs should have the contact information for the local troop(s) to provide to the prospective Scout and his/her family.

What is National Youth Leadership Training?NYLT is the entry-level program for youth ages 13-17 to learn and practice leadership skills with their peers in an outdoor environment. Leadership skills are essential for all youth to navigate everyday challenges and be more successful with school and college/university, band/sports, church, community service, work, family life, and, of course, Troop and Crew youth leadership. Scouts participating in the NYLT course are better prepared for life.

Qualifications:

- · Youth ages 13/14-17 years old (Troop or Venture Crew)
- · Earned 1st Class rank or higher
- · Recommended by the Scoutmaster for NYLT

Scholarships: Youth may request scholarships for registration fees through their Troop or Venture Crew, the Council office, or the NYLT course itself.

Course Leadership: The NYLT courses are run by youth and adult volunteers from sponsoring councils. Youth volunteers have completed the NYLT course and are ready to take on new leadership challenges.



What is Trainer's EDGE?

Trainer's EDGE helps Adult Leaders, Volunteers, and Scouts BSA develop communication skills for effective presentations. Learn techniques to engage your audience, enhance your presentation, and gain confidence in your delivery. What is Wood Badge?

Wood Badge is the most advanced training course for adults offered by the Boy Scouts of America. The training course is rich in Scouting history and tradition.

Prerequisites:

- Be registered adult member of the Boy Scouts of America
- Have completed basic training requirements for your registered Scouting position prior to the course.
- Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. All participants are required to complete the Annual Health and Medical Record (parts A, B and C) : <u>https://filestore.scouting.org/filestore/HealthSafety/pdf/680-001_ABC.pdf</u>

Catholic Religious Emblems Program A Scout is Reverent



One of the points of the Scout Law is that a scout is Reverent, and the Scout Oath reminds us that we have a Duty to God. At the beginning of February, many churches and other places of worship recognized the scouts that are members of their congregation on Scout Sunday or Scout Sabbath. This day is recognized yearly and oftentimes is used to award scouts specific religious recognition or show how scouts have been helpful in their religious community.

Since not all scouts have the exact same faith, Scouts BSA allows each scout to explore their faith through a separate Religious Emblem program that is specific to their faith. These programs vary, but most are designed for the scout to explore their faith with someone from their church or place or worship, or a designated counselor. General information for the various programs can be found on the <u>national scouting site</u>, and the council office has workbooks for some of the most common faiths in the trading post.

One of the programs that is more counselor driven and focuses on group discussion is the <u>Catholic AD Altare Dei religious emblem</u>. One of the scoutmasters in the council, Mr. Avery, has gone through their counselor training, and is just beginning to hold sessions for this emblem at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church in Bakersfield. They will be meeting about once a month and will take about 6 months to complete. 2024 Cub Scout Advancement Changes Effective June 1, 2024

The four areas of improvement are the **Bobcat badge**, **Cub Scout Adventures**, **Webelos**, **and Cub Scout Awards**. Bobcat will no longer be a badge that is earned once when a Cub Scout joins. It will become a required Adventure for each rank and earned each year.

Safety in Scouting

Incident Reporting Helps

Timely and complete incident reporting provides the BSA with an opportunity for analysis of incidents that occur and promotes continuous improvement of our programs. In our experience, the sooner a clear, concise, and complete incident report is made, the sooner that an appropriate response to the incident can occur.



GENERAL INFORMATION

What is an incident? There are three types of reportable incidents:

- Near Miss—A near miss does not result in injury, illness, or damage, by definition, but it had the
 potential to do so.
- General Liability—Events or allegations of injury, illness, or property damage, including employment, director, and officer issues.
- Youth Protection/Membership Infraction—Allegations of abuse, violations of BSA guidelines or policies, or inappropriate behavior by a Scout/Scout leader/parent/other.

Why report an incident? The information reported from incidents helps identify areas for improvement so we can help prevent the reoccurrence of similar incidents. The BSA cannot address a concern if we do not know about it. Reporting incidents promptly is also critical so the BSA can respond in a timely manner and manage claims properly.

When do I report an incident? You should immediately contact your local council to report and get assistance with serious, fatal or abuse incidents. Report within 24 hours if an injury or illness cannot be treated by Scout-rendered first aid, a medical professional such as a doctor or nurse was needed, or an ambulance was called.

How do I report an incident? There are incident reporting tools to assist you in collecting the facts of the incident to provide to the council. This is available on the council website <u>www.sscbsa.org</u>. Scroll down on the home page to "Incident Reporting Tools".

<u>Reporting tips</u>: It is important that incident reports are filled out as completely & timely as possible. This will help bring clarity to the situation and avoid unnecessary calls or emails for additional information. Photographs of the site, facilities, vehicles, or equipment can add value to the report. Remember to include only pertinent facts about the incident. Do not assign blame or include personal opinions. Stick to the facts.
